10.02 Confirmation of the minutes of the 9th governing council meeting held on October 31, 2015

The minutes of the 9th governing council meeting held on October 31, 2015 were circulated among the members.

10.03 Report of actions taken on points that arise in the 9th governing council meeting

Resolution: The hospital administration to be managed by senior faculty.

Action taken :Mr.Bipin Puneeth appointed.

Appointment of Governing Council member in place of Mr. Pradeep Shankar may please be initiated.

Resolution: Suggested senior physiotherapist faculty from other colleges.

Action taken 1: Prof. Savitha Ravindra, Principal & HOD,M.S.Ramaiah College of Physiotherapy has been suggested for appointing as member.

Action taken 2: The idea of external faculty member for governing council meeting dropped as we have to wait for the date approved by them for the meeting , which would cause in postponement of GC meeting

Resolution: Discussed and JSS MVP suggested to fill 4 BPT and 2 MPT vacant Govt. seats as Management seats.

Admission process for the year 2016-17 to start early, Mr. Bipin Puneeth and Mrs. Aditi Bhandiwad are in charge for admission process.

Resolution: Principal admitted that there is a mistake in tabulating no. of patients which shown drastic decrease in revenue last year.

MS insisted to show the revenue generated separately for OP and IP. Complaints about patients not treated adequately because of change of faculty every day.

Principal said the senior faculty are posted to attend the doctors/VIPs and Private ward patients and junior faculty for routine patients. This system has been in place since Sept and there is no break in continuity of patient care as of now. MS said if measures were taken then the matter is resolved.

10.04.02: NSS: The NSS camp was conducted at Shivalli of Mandya District in 2nd week of March 16.

There was an overwhelming response from the villagers towards the Physiotherapy treatment given. About 1400 sessions of treatment including exercise sessions were given to patients with musculoskeletal ailments and exercise were taught to each patients after electrical physiotherapy modality and importance of exercise was explained.

Principal said that most have failed in pharmacology. As many are repeaters and they don't attend the classes regularly as they have to prepare for the exams for which they were failed. Mentoring of students is regularly happening and their difficulties in studies are assisted and problems are discussed and in spite the results are like this. The staff representative Renuka said after mentoring found that the student's interest and time given each day for studying is not satisfactory.

Dr Manjunath and Mr. Mahesh felt that the mentoring programme is not being very effective and the faculty is not putting effort and insisted that the senior faculty should take initiatives and see to that they improve in their academics. Insisted to conduct monthly meeting with the parents if the student's performance is bad.
