15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

JSS College of Physiotherapy is part of the larger JSS institutions catering to diverse disciplines such as medical sciences, engineering sciences, and humanities. This is a major source of collaborations for multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary exchanges. These have resulted in meaningful collaborations in services, academics, and research and more significantly in community engagement. The parent organization has a close relationship with the government and nongovernmental agencies in this part of the state. These relationships offer a variety of opportunities in terms of field visits, community engagements, clinical postings, etc., The health institute is attached to 1800 bedded super specialty hospital where physiotherapists have complete autonomy by way of blanket referral in core departments and needbased referral in other departments ensures that students have enviable opportunities to learn clinical skills in an interdisciplinary manner. The institute has introduced an interdisciplinary unit catering to rehabilitation. Students are exposed to interdisciplinary evaluation, goals setting, devising a plan of care and work with patients without boundaries.

Integrated learning takes place as a part of the academic presentations; the students are given the opportunity to present the topic, which is integrated with other subjects vertically and horizontally. The clinical learning and practice are made as an interdisciplinary event. The faculty and students take part in case/rounds discussion along with other specialties. Moreover, the setting of physiotherapy within a mainstream physical education curriculum is an excellent source of interdisciplinary learning.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institute has not registered with ABC. The institute is affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences (RGUHS) and comes within the scope of the health institutes. However the institute encourages the students to register under ABC as per their choice.

The institute has designed their own curricular and pedagogical approaches within the approved framework laid down by the RGUHS. These are in form of lesson plan(LP), Practical Manual (PM), students competency assessment log book (SCALB), AMOCS. The lesson plan is designed to cater the present need and this meets the standards of physiotherapy both at national and international level. The reference books teaching materials, assignments, and the mode of assessments are clearly defined in each module. This process of curriculum delivery helps the faculty and students to execute the objectives effectively. The LP, PM and SCALB are recognised as some of the good practices in academic and clinical areas of the institute.

17.Skill development:

The institute engages students and faculty to enhance their capability. The programmes and courses are incorporated into the curriculum which includes problem based learning (PBL), fitness, soft skills, English and professional language skills. The courses are provided as an add-on course which is planned in the year of program. Yoga is planned along with the fitness programs, which are provided as regular ongoing programs. The skills of the students are identified at the initial phase during induction and on the assessment sessions. The identified students are mentored by the seniors and faculty on a regular basis. Some of the value-based education which is delivered to students includes citizenship values, ethics and constitutional. The students are encouraged to involve themselves in NSS and participate in the programs which include the universal human values. Various programs are organised by NSS including the health and community programs, where students and faculty are exposed to various situations, through which they are trained to achieve and develop skills.

Physiotherapy skills taught through theoretical that is practiced through supervised self practice sessions and the gathered knowledge and skills are translated into practice through clinical practice. The process is strengthened by having short term courses, workshops and conference attendance and presentation. The courses pertaining to physiotherapy and skills are identified through online including PhysioPlus, Physiopedia, and other online platforms and offered to students through online. These are credited for their evaluation.

Students are exposed to ethical and value-based education through postings in various community areas. It is also carried out in theory modules followed by practical modules followed by clinical modules which drive students towards the global excellence, the international engagement cell committee of the college frequently outlooks the global strategies in education and helps in implementing those into the current educational practices of the college based on their benefits to the students.

The good practices of the institute include the skill development program in the professional language skills and communication and the professional skills which are developed during the course of

study.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The institutes integrated the Indian knowledge system by incorporating the specific programs in the academic curriculum. The programs include teaching Indian language which includes Kannada during the course of study. The Indian system resource material, which includes books, audio and video are available in the college library. The institute being an health institute it offers medium of instruction in English only, but assists students to take up challenges by offering translation facilities and support service, the mentors also provide support to students in the overcoming the language barriers.

The Indian culture and tradition is promoted and practiced in institution. Some of the examples are organising cultural fest and celebration of ethnic day in commemoration of the Indian culture. This enables the students from different places to understand and learn the culture and tradition of respective states. Festivals of India are celebrated by all faculties and students, events are organised in those days, and some examples include celebration Onam, Diwali, Pongal etc. Some of the good practices pertaining to the integration of Indian knowledge system include commemoration of festivals and days by faculties and students and sharing the importance of their culture and tradition.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The institution constantly works towards quality education in acquiring knowledge and skills. The institute has adopted the curriculum designing based on the need and is delivered to the students as theoretical, practical and clinical skills. The students are trained in these aspects orderly by acquiring knowledge through theory classes that includes didactic, self directed learning (SDL), assignments and seminars. The skills are developed through practicals and translating into practice at the clinical level.

These are achieved through planning the curriculum as courses, which are divided into modules. Each course is defined with the course outcome (CO), that describes the significance of essential learning and the students have achieved, these are demonstrated at the end of the course. Similarly the program is defined with an objective and program outcomes (POs) which are closely related and aligned with the graduate attributes. The student has an option to carryout and performs to excellence through the learning process and opportunities provided at various platforms, example a student who has excelled in theory can adopt to do research and the institute offers guidance and mentors to help the student achieve his goals. Also program specific objectives are planned and laid down for the specific program.

20.Distance education/online education:

Owing to as a health institute and being affiliated to the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences the institute does not independently provide online or distance education (programs). However the institute adopts online programs that are incorporated into the curriculum and are delivered to the students. The courses include from Physiopedia, PhysioPlus, SWAYAM and other platforms.

In keeping with graduate attributes and generic outcomes of health care professionals, many of these lessons are imparted through experiential learning. Ethics and administration are incorporated in the syllabus which emphasizes the students to follow the ethical principles of inpatient care

Students are posted in the district early intervention center and they get an experiential understanding of families' struggles with children with special needs.Sports week and cultural week and academic weeks were conducted to bring out students' talent.National Integration Camps: Through the National Service Scheme (NSS) units of the college renowned experts are invited to talk on issues like Swachh Bharath, life skills, disaster management, food adulteration, and all field activities are planned with a focus on gender equity, woman empowerment, human values, and Indian Culture. The students also participate in tree plantation and are given orientation about topics on environmental sustainability like preservation of water, rational use of environmental resources, etc. The NSS Unit regularly conducts yoga sessions and celebrates world yoga day. The NSS activities enable students to grow individually and also as a group.

2.3.5 - The teaching learning process of the institution nurtures creativity, analytical skills and innovation among students

Developing knowledge is delivered through didactic, seminars, and assignments; these are planned every year through unit plans and lesson plans. The skill component is addressed through practical sessions, using case scenarios to instill reasoning, demonstrations, and practice, which are monitored and documented through the practical manual. The revised practical manual has scoring for each module to score the student's performance which will be reflected in their internal assessment marks.

Once the practical skill is learned, the translation of knowledge and skill takes place in the clinics through patient assessment and treatment planning. This aspect of affective functioning is captured by the Student Competency Assessment Log Book (SCALB) for UG and PG. AMOCs are introduced for interns to score their skills in the clinical.

Research and evidence-based practice (EBP) is emphasized which are achieved through Journal club, EBP presentations, and case conferences. Interns and postgraduates keep a portfolio of selected patients.

Creativity among students in academic skills is enhanced by involving students in audio-video recording activities, one such activity is clinical skills recorded by our students. Autonomy is exercised to the student's council, under the guidance of faculty to organize events; they are guided accordingly to achieve the best.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with examination-related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient. Question papers for internal examination are set by subject teachers, scrutinized by the head of respective departments and answer keys submitted prior to examination.

As per our policy, every internal exam paper, in theory, is corrected blindly by two evaluators. Scripts with a difference of 15% or more in marks awarded between valuators are considered for a third valuation. The third valuator is normally considered as a senior faculty member. Internal assessment marks are displayed within 2 weeks of examination. The expected answers as per key are discussed with the student at which time the students have the opportunity to self evaluate their answer papers.

The students are given feedback about their performance and suggestions are given for their improvement and are free to discuss these with the valuators and if responses are not acceptable to them they may approach the grievance cell.

The grievances related to university exams and results are directly addressed to RGUHS, a formal process prescribed by the university is followed, the institution guides and facilitates the procedure. After the results are announced, the students are reminded about options to resolve grievances. These include a request for photocopies of answer sheets.

The institute takes sustainable initiatives in reforming the learning outcome-based curriculum framework which is delivered through lesson plan (LP), Practical manual (PM), and SCALB. These competencies are inclusive of generic skills like communication, ethics, respect, empathy, and specific one's likeability to undertake several discipline-specific skills like body weight supported treadmill training, standard assessments for specific conditions, and skills of professional development like critical reading and appraisal of published research in order to cull and assimilate evidence into everyday practice.A large part of these resources is online resources including our library e-repository. We have incorporated plagiarism detection software for the assessment of assignments and student-delivered work. To foster this we have several project-based modules where students work individually or in small groups to articulate, explore and answer questions.Apart from this Journal Club (JC), evidence-based practice (EBP) presentations; self-directed learning (SDL) becomes an integral part of the curriculum. Core competencies are emphasized during clinical training. Advanced methods of the teaching-learning process are adopted with lecture capturing system (LCS), Google classroom (GCR), and digital library.Clinical reasoning skills are adopted in the teaching and learning process, which are evaluated through case presentations, case conferences, and practical examinations.

The parent-teacher meetings are conducted after every internal assessment. Apart from these physical meetings, a WhatsApp group is created between the class coordinator and parents and students each year and informal discussions are undertaken. The feedback is analyzed and in consort with teacher observations in class, mentor

reports, and internal assessment marks, students are identified who need additional work. these may include advanced work or remedial measures.Remedial measures are carried out after each evaluation process. Informal communication with mentoring is facilitated as a consistent measure to support and encourage students, and research scholars are solicited to volunteer time to perform the above activities along with the staff.First-year Remedial classes for the students in specific subjects are organized. Progress is discussed every month during class coordinator meetings and information is given to parents. Additional assessment is conducted through seminars, assignments, and written examinations. These results are analyzed and discussed with the respective students/class, and the mentor identifies needs and inculcates students to overcome hurdles. The outcome is analyzed through the internal assessment. A formal analysis of results is undertaken and discussed during governing council meetings. Suggestions from members are taken up and acted upon.

3.2 - Innovation Ecosystem

The innovations in clinical practice include using the Telerehabilitation services for the patients due to the COVID pandemic. Also, the staff and students were sensitized to safe practices for the prevention of COVID in Hospital clinics and workplaces through live workshops and demonstration

Academics For students who are posted in clinics, who couldn't come due to lockdown were given the case scenarios which were in line with the objectives mentioned in the SCALB (Student competency assessment log book) as a document that will integrate their knowledge and learning to the clinical practice.

In the hospital patients who are fit for discharge and were not able to come due to travel restrictions were given education material and were followed through Telerehabilitation to ensure that there is a carryover effect and maintenance of the benefits of the treatment they took. The department of rehabilitation has followed up Post COVID cases and was given Telerehabilitation and Yoga Therapy for 6 months.

Also as a part of community responsibility, the college took training for traffic police personnel on handling suspected spinal cord injury individuals during accident sites, which was well received by them, and the same proposal was sent to ICMR for which the grant was awarded to the college.

The Institution has adequate facilities for teaching and

learning.viz. Classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc. which is far more than adequate infrastructural facilities mandated by the affiliating university (RGUHS).

The campus is entirely internet enabled with the connection in every classroom and laboratory. Each laboratory is enabled with a LCD TV on which videos of practical skills are played to ensure that students can learn by repetition. Every lecture hall is enabled with LCD projectors, lecture capture technology (webcam and microphone) and audio facilities. The college also boasts of a seminar room to seat 150 and a smaller one in the hospital for clinical presentations which seat 30 members. Also for community outreach programmes college has adopted a village- Devnoor in Mysore district.

The college staff and students has the access for 1800 bedded super specialty hospital where they have enviable opportunities to learn clinical skills.Recently the Student council with the help of students have assisted in setting up a museum which has old equipment's and tools used by the physiotherapist and also a model accessible home is built for better understanding about access for persons with locomotor disability

As a new venture JSS College of Physiotherapy have started traditional folk games for its students which was also well accepted. They are lagoori, gillidanda, Pallankuzhi etc . A dedicated Physical education instructor has been appointed by the institution to oversee the activities

The college has access to two auditoria which is 530 seat and 250 seat separately which is well equipped with all modern facilities like centralized air conditioning, public address system, LCDprojector and internet facility. The campus is situated close to the city center and various facilities are available within a radius of 1 km, includinga post office, various banks, and other urban facilities. Within the campus, we have access to an ATM maintained by SBI, a cafeteria , and safe and well-lit roads and parking facilities including designated disabled vehicle Parking. The College is using solar power generated within the campus. The ramp and lifts are situated at a distance from the main entrance and wheelchairs are available on request to transport persons who may have difficulty negotiating

stairs.

The collegehouses arehabilitation center with trained doctors and nurses in attendance at all times and serves as the first aid center for our college. For other health care needs the hospital is within 200 m of the college with ambulance availability. The second floor which houses the library and various labs is accessible through a lift and ramps. The college has designated disabled-friendly toilets on the first (main) floor.

A dedicated girl's hostel with accommodation for 110 residents is available less than half a km from the college. All these areas are having Fire extinguishers in case of any fire mishap.

4.2 - Clinical, Equipment and Laboratory Learning Resources

Our college is attached to an 1800 bedded super-specialty teaching hospital that is within the same campus. The hospital is NABH

accredited and a physiotherapy department is an autonomous unit within it. The physiotherapy department of about 8400 sq feet boasts one of the largest departments by area which has separate sections for pediatrics, orthopedics, neurology, cardiopulmonary, and a gait laboratory. We have separate patient care services including inpatient and outpatient orthopedics, neurology, neurosurgery, pediatrics, OBG, cardiopulmonary, general medicine, and surgery including burns, plastic surgery, transplant units, and rehabilitation departments divided into institutional and community services. Early intervention services are undertaken in the NICU using evidence-based methods, high-risk clinics - Belaku, the district early intervention center, and school health programs. The faculty and students are also posted in the geriatric clinic where high-risk individuals for falls will be screened and will be managed. The department and college together have an enviable collection of evaluation and treatment equipment and instruments. All college equipment is available for use in the hospital as well.

Community training is achieved through a vast network of special schools, mainstream schools, senior centers, and a tribal health center with residential facilities. Ergonomic experience is imparted through collaboration with industries/ offices and sports training through collaboration with the government-run sports center and Mysore University. These facilities allow us to be able to provide postgraduate programs in all core areas of physiotherapy.

The integrated library system (ILS) is a computer-based system that was started in the year 2016 with Easy Lib Software (ELS) Pvt Ltd as a resource planning system for the library to manage internal and external resources. It was incorporated and utilized to track items orders made, bills paid, and patrons who have borrowed. The nature of automation is partial.

To track library utilization, a biometric attendance system was incorporated in 2017. This allows a method of recording library visits and duration of utilization. Resources utilization is tracked using easy lib software. The use of online resources is tracked through relevant sites.

As the classes were online due to the pandemic and students wanted the reference books from the library. So the librarian scanned all the prescribed books by RGUHS and was given to the students through mail on request.

All the online classes were recorded and were given to the students for future reference from the library as some of the students were from remote villages and their internet connection is sketchy

EPA is implemented to evaluate the intern's competency in all the clinical areas, It evaluates the assessment methods, clinical reasoning, documentation, patient handover, teamwork, patient and family education, and effective communication skills. 8.1.2 - Steps/procedures adopted by the college to train students in Clinical Skills and Simulation Laboratories in advanced physiotherapy techniques such as manual therapy, functional electrical stimulation, Biofeedback, etc.

There are clinical skills laboratories that support teaching indepth skills to students. The labs are accessible during college hours so the students have full liberty to use them for practice. Recordings of skills are available for self-directed learning through dedicated LCD TV sets in all labs

Movement sciences- The lab consists of Exercise therapy, electrotherapy, and Biomechanics equipment, models, Evaluation grid, and modalities: like a suspension table, shoulder wheel, etc. Ultrasound, TENS, Laser, etc. joint models, human skeletal & osteology model. Posture evaluation is taught using posture grid and plumb line and also through Kinovea software.

The orthopedic skills lab has a manual therapy couch, treadmill, and treatment couches. Instruments like pressure biofeedback unit, Semmes Weinstein monofilament, volumeter, in-hand manipulation test, etc.

The cardio lab has a Doppler pulse measurement device, pulmonary function test(PFT), mannequin, perineometer, etc.

Neuro and Paediatric have a nerve conduction study(NCV), a clinical test of sensory interaction in balance(CTSIB), etc.

community-based rehabilitation (CBR) lab has splinting equipment, a work hardening station, assistive devices, and adapted equipment.

The documentation of the work held in the labs is done through a practical lab manual which each student is to have mandatorily.

Quality of care is one of the vital components of a hospital and patient care.Our institution is delivering these services where individuals are provided desired health outcomes and along with this emphasis is given to achieving effective patient-centered health care. Safety precautions of the patient are considered of utmost & specific precautions include the dress code of the therapist and the use of safety equipment like a gait belt which is an assistive device used to stabilize the trunk by the therapist in order to have efficient control of safe transfer of patients.

Clinical Case Conferences weekly to introduce themselves to a wide range of patient care practices. Infection control is the key element in health care. The importance of hand hygiene and appropriate protections which include vaccinations and the use of disposable gloves and masks. Posters are displayed regarding hand washing and ergonomic guidelines in the department. Students are also educated regarding the ergonomics while treating the patients and are provided as posters in the hospital and the workplaces. Equipment safety will be taken care of by doing timely maintenance

and routine calibration by the institution. Timely revision of the clinical protocols and the pathways are carried out.

We instituted a competency evaluation system in 2014. SCALB- Student Competency Assessment Log Book lists the core competencies expected of a physiotherapist. The SCALB is given to the students from the third academic year. This book is revised and updated annually. Clinical competency for undergraduate Eight core roles are to be fulfilled by each student and intern. These are the generic competencies of a physiotherapist. Role 1- Expert Role 2-Communicator Role 3- Collaborator Role 4- Manager Role 5- Advocate Role 6-Scholarly practitioner Role 7- Professional Role 8- Educator Specific competencies are listed thereafter. Each section should be completed by the student when they are posted in their respective posting, a signature from the respective clinical supervisor should be taken, and only after which the student can change his/her posting. The clinical supervisor has to read each competency and correlate it to the content by using the guidelines for marking. If the student doesn't fill the competency for which a valid justification should be written in the comment section. The rubric is added so that the competency performance criteria can be added to the academic excellence.

The steps/procedure adopted by the college to sensitize students to, Contemporary medico-legal practices, the Consumer protection act, Indemnity insurance, Therapist liability issues, and Patient safety.

All the above are done through ethics class. It is a subsidiary subject (in the second year). A written signed informed consent (ICF) is obtained when patients are approached for participation in the examination, and case presentation/ research. In case of any adverse event however minor, incident reporting is undertaken. We also orient students and the staff regarding medico-legal and ethical components of practice during induction annually and during all new appointments of staff. Other initiatives include the use of clinical pathways to ensure minimum standards of consistent care, weekly case conferences to proactively correct poor practices, and a clear plan of care for each patient for a better understanding of treatment to the patient and patient's attender. All therapists are covered under the indemnity insurance coverage of the hospital. The cost of treatment is explained to the patient and caretaker in detail and orientationis givenon different health schemes provided. Whenever a staff or therapist violates any rules of the hospital or feels disrespected by a fellow co-worker a grievance report is filed.

8.1.8 - Steps/procedures adopted by the college to introduce students to healthcare practices that are inter-disciplinary, such as clinical psychology, social work, wellness programs, Yoga etc. during their clinical training during the year.

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The physical medicine and rehabilitation department is committed to
interdisciplinary rehabilitation and has dedicated Physical
therapists (PT), Occupational therapists (OT), Clinical
psychologists, Speech-language pathologists (SLP), Physicians, and
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Rehabilitation nurses. Students are posted in this department from the fourth year onwards and take part in the interdisciplinary evaluation, goal setting, devising a plan of care, and working with patients without boundaries. Home evaluation and therapeutic outings are conducted periodically with the participation of all staff and students posted in the dept.Community postings are integrated with the social worker and specifically, the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) postings introduce students to the aspect of inclusive education. Moreover, evaluation of children for fitness in mainstream schools sensitizes students on the role of a physiotherapist in the primordial prevention of non-communicable diseases.

Cardiac rehabilitation for patients with cardiac diseases for inpatient and out-patient is a team work. The cardiacphysician refers the case and the whole teamsees the patient counsel and plans institutional rehabilitation or self-management through a home program.

8.1.9 - Measures taken by the college to familiarize students to Rehabilitation and Disability practices as per WHO guidelines relevant to community-based rehab (CBR) and rehabilitation in India.

The institution follows the world health organization (WHO) guidelines for disability and the community-based rehabilitation (CBR) matrix. Under the health arm of the matrix, screening is done in neonatal intensive care units (NICUs) in order to initiate early detection and intervention. Infants are also screened in the highrisk clinic. If an infant is identified who is a potential candidate for rehabilitation, he/ she will be referred to the Physiotherapy out-patient department (OPD) for management. For the promotion of health and disability, we give the community education through Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) disability camps and National Service Scheme (NSS) health awareness camps. According to the patients' needs, we prescribe tailor-made assistive devices for patients with disability. We conduct programs on the inpatient department (IDPD) aimed at the advocacy of the public works department (PWD). Students are posted in the Cardiac department where they treat and work with other disciplines and learn teamwork and understand the long-term

management of the team.

The college has all the Equipment and Instrumentation which are needed for evaluation and treatment for physiotherapy. There are 91abs that are well equipped with models and equipment. Movement science lab constitutes BIOMECHANICS LAB,EXERCISE THERAPY LAB,EXERCISE THERAPY LAB, ELECTROTHERAPY THERAPY LAB, and GAIT LAB. There areMusculoskeletal lab, Sports lab, Cardiopulmonary lab, Neuro & Pediatric lab , and CBR lab. The students are given access to all these equipment based on the type of assessment that they are performing or on the basis of the treatment that they are administering. Standard operating procedures (SOP) are available for all equipment/instruments which helps them to understand the operating mechanism of the devices. Under the supervision of staff, clinical staff, and postgraduates the students are allowed to use the equipment.
